

January, February & March.

Take part in our Key Stage Two workshops to explore these themes, characters and more.

We offer a two-hour practical workshop to be delivered in your school from mid-January to mid-March (at a date and time convenient to you) and aimed at Years 4, 5 and /or 6 students.

The session for up to 40 pupils provides opportunities to explore ideas through Drama and Art, and allows for work to be produced in both of these areas. Your students' work will then form part of an exhibition in the foyer of the theatre for the duration of the show!

The workshop will be led by Lisa Hudson, an experienced teacher of Drama and English, and Victoria Byron, an equally experienced teacher and children's illustrator.

The fee for the workshop is £250. This fee will be reduced to £200 if you make a group booking to see the show at the theatre.
