## **About Exeter Northcott Theatre**

Outstanding theatre in the heart of Devon



Built in 1967 on the University of Exeter's stunning Streatham campus, Exeter Northcott Theatre is Exeter's flagship venue, loved by audiences and artists alike. With the recent appointment of Paul Jepson as Artistic & Executive Director 2015 sees the theatre returning to Arts Council England's national funding portfolio and also producing once more, beginning with our 2015 family Christmas show – A Christmas Carol.

A 460 seat mid-scale house, the theatre plays a central role in the cultural life of the community it serves – 551,000 homes within a 45 minute drive-time including a population of 120,000 in Exeter (during the day this swells to 250,000 people), and is a magnet for thousands of people of all ages who are interested in attending live performance. From families introducing their younger members to theatre for the first time to a lively retired community that loves the classics, we cater for everyone. As a University City there is no shortage of people of all ages who are adventurous and eclectic in their tastes as well as schools who value the opportunity to bring their students to see a live show as part of their learning.

The Exeter Northcott Theatre's beautifully designed stage and auditorium works exceptionally well for all types of theatre and dance. Our audiences are notably engaged and enthusiastic making every performance memorable and the theatre is regularly cited as a favourite venue by national touring companies for this reason. Touring companies also compliment our exceptionally high quality technical and marketing support.





Exeter Northcott Theatre collaborates with leading edge funded touring companies to present new writing, classic plays, physical theatre and devised/experimental work (e.g. Out of Joint, Headlong, English Touring, Vamos, Shared Experience and Theatre Alibi). We have recently worked hard to strengthen our commercial and pre West End offer and have presented tours of *The Mousetrap, Under Milk Wood, Birdsong* and *The History Boys*.

In addition to our strong drama offering we are a regional corner stone venue for dance, programming national touring artists and supporting workshops as well as providing opportunities for emerging companies and performers. We have a long-standing relationship with English Touring Opera and have begun a three year agreement marketing and ticketing Bournemouth Symphony Orchestra in the University of Exeter's Great Hall, adjacent to the theatre.







A major element of the programme is our work for families and young people, who currently represent 40% of our annual attendance. We programme work for family audiences of all ages, including work for early years.

The Northcott has a national reputation for training technical theatre staff and the development of skills across all theatre disciplines with a particular focus on student employability is now a major focus. Our **Creative Futures** initiative is a partnership with the University of Exeter Student Guild that is helping to develop student employability opportunities and deepen connections between the cultural sector and student body.





The theatre has a rich history of developing new writing and nurturing artists at the beginning of their careers. An array of new writing has been premiered at the theatre over the decades; from the first public performances of Edward Bond's *Bingo* in 1973 through Howard Barker's *BLOK/EKO* in 2011 to the 2013 production of Dawn King's *Ciphers*, Exeter audiences have enjoyed the opportunity to be in at the beginning of exciting new works and careers. We celebrate some of these stories in an exhibition in the theatre foyer and are planning a major celebration for our Golden Jubilee in 2017.

In 2013 the theatre became a registered charity. Since then it has worked hard to raise funds to support its core running costs and to deliver on its exciting and expanding new plans. The theatre hosts a number of fundraising events each year, including its Charity Command Performance. In addition to this it increasingly works with corporates and individuals to fund new projects such as the return to producing work and the newly proposed Young Company.





# **Job Description**

# **Chief Electrician**

### **Exeter Northcott Theatre**

### **Purpose of Post**

The Chief Electrician position will be part of a team responsible for delivering the technical elements of performances at the Northcott Theatre. The role is mainly based around that of a normal Chief Electricians responsibilities but will also include operating flying equipment and Duty Stage Managing.

**Department:** Technical Team

**Responsible to:** Technical Manager

### **Duties & Responsibilities**

- 1. Be responsible for the maintenance and upkeep of all electrical production elements including installation equipment specific to show running.
- 2. Operate lighting and sound systems during performances and rehearsals.
- 3. Duty LX where required both visiting companies shows and in-house shows.
- 4. Liaise and coordinate with the touring companies Production Manager and Re-lights during fit-ups and get outs.
- 5. Manage and supervise Electrics, Sound and AV teams for in-house productions, co-produced shows and visiting company productions where required.
- 6. Deputise for the Technical Manager in his absence.
- 7. Attend production meetings and staff meetings as required.
- 8. Maintain the Exeter Northcott lighting, sound and AV equipment stock.
- 9. Deliver training to technicians, students and casuals as required.
- 10. Assist in any preparation for productions and maintain the paperwork necessary for the smooth running of the performances both received and in-house.

- 11. Assist in answering visiting company's questions and concerns with guidance from the rest of the technical team and ensure they are contacted in advance of their visit.
- 12. Act on any Show Reported technical notes and report any issues to the Technical Manager.
- 13. Maintain the high production standards during the run of a production.
- 14. Provide appropriate technical support during rehearsal of projects.
- 15. Ensure a safe working environment during rehearsals, fit-ups, performances and get outs.
- 16. Ensure that visiting companies' technical riders are present prior to their visit.
- 17. Work with the rest of the technical team to maintain the ENT stage and rigging equipment.
- 18. Ensure that the Scene Dock, Lighting Box, Trap Room and Fly Floors are kept tidy and fit for use.
- 19. To assist in the smooth running of all Fit-ups / Get-outs and Turn-arounds.
- 20. Maintenance and upkeep of all Set Elements both toured and produced.
- 21. Help identify potential equipment purchases or maintenance of existing equipment.
- 22. Help maintain existing equipment and perform PAT testing after suitable training has been issued.
- 23. Give advance notice as far as possible about any resources (equipment, staff) that are needed to deliver the production.
- 24. Ensure that required equipment has been arranged. For example piano hires and tuners.
- 25. To maintain and update any equipment or files as required.
- 26. Provide detailed information for archive purposes. To keep accurate backups of all files as necessary both general admin and computerised show systems.
- 27. Ensure the supplies required for productions are topped up and the Technical Manager is made aware of any shortages in advance of requiring them.
- 28. Have responsibility for issues relating to COSHH, LOLER and HSE legislation.
- 29. To carry out other duties as requested by the Technical Manager or Theatre Management.

### Responsibilities of all staff members

- To be flexible and to undertake any other reasonable duties as requested by Management
- To take an active part in co-operating with and supporting other staff and departments in the achievement of the company's aims

- To adhere to all Exeter Northcott Theatre policies (including Equal Opportunities and Child Protection)
- To be aware of, and comply with, rules and legislation pertaining to Health & Safety at Work
- To be an advocate of the company
- To attend company events and be aware of the breadth of the company's work
- To contribute ideas and suggestions for the increased success and effectiveness of the Exeter Northcott Theatre
- To maintain confidentiality at all times particularly with respect to information that may be covered by the Data Protection Act

### **Flexibility Clause**

- In this post you will from time to time undertake such other duties, training and hours of work as may be reasonably required and that are consistent with the general level of responsibility of this role.
- You will be required to work evenings and weekends where required.
- On occasion you will be required to work over your 39 hours per week contract
- On occasion you may be asked to travel to other venues to receive a show or to tour a produced show into another venue.
- The list of responsibilities within this document are not exhaustive and the employee will need to perform duties outside of this as operationally required and at the discretion of their line manager.

### **Person Specification**

- Either / or Electrical qualifications e.g. City and Guilds Electrical Installation
   Commercial or Domestic. Or Theatre electrical qualifications e.g. City and Guilds Electrics for the Entertainment Industry
- Four GCSE grade D or above to include English Language and Mathematics
- An interest in both theatre and the technical equipment you will be using
- Good articulacy, literacy and numeracy
- Good ICT Skills
- Excellent interpersonal and communication skills

- Ability to work as part of a team
- Ability to work under pressure
- Reliable and punctual
- Conscientious
- Commitment to the plans for the future direction of the Exeter Northcott
- Flexible, adaptable and positive within a team
- Available to work evenings and weekends

### **Desirable**

- Test and Inspect Electrical qualifications
- Portable Appliance Testing qualifications and experience
- Experience of working in a theatre, arts organisation or production company
- A driving license is desirable.
